



**Ad-Hoc Query on Statistics of minors held in facilities used for asylum or immigration detention on the 15<sup>th</sup> November 2016 and on the 1<sup>st</sup> December 2016**

**Requested by COM on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2016**

**Compilation updated on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2016**

**1. Background Information**

We would appreciate if the EU Member States could complete the tables attached providing data relating to **third-country nationals who are below 18 years of age** and who were held in immigration or asylum detention on the **15<sup>th</sup> November** and **1<sup>st</sup> December 2016** respectively. All minors, both unaccompanied and accompanied with family members, should be covered.

The data should only include individuals who are in **facilities used for asylum or immigration detention**. It should **not** include individuals **temporarily held in border areas or police cells or other facilities** (such as hotspots) used to place temporarily individuals following the initial arrest for identification and registration procedures.

To qualify as “detention” for the purpose of this information collection, the individual must be **deprived of liberty** – meaning that he/she cannot go out of the facility unattended. The statistics should cover all minors deprived of liberty, regardless of the term used to describe the regime under national law.

To ensure comparability between EU Member States the data provided should reflect the situation on the **15<sup>th</sup> of November** and **1<sup>st</sup> December 2016 at 7.00 in the morning**.

## **2. Methodology**

The EU Member States should contact each detention facility individually asking them to complete the form below.

Please note in Q 3, when providing with an answer, specify if the minor is unaccompanied or accompanied by family members and indicate the exact status of the minor, e.g. applicant for international protection, person detained under the Dublin procedure, third-country nationals in pre-removal detention, non-admitted and detained at the borders (if relevant), the place/type of detention and the reasons justifying longer detention of the specific minor.

The information received from each facility should then be compiled country-wide using the same form. Please name the facilities covered in the MS. Under Q3, please include the three cases of minors in longest detention as reported from individual facilities.

We need to clarify that in Belgium children are not detained in closed detention centres: Unaccompanied minors are brought to specific facilities (Observation and Orientation Centres, OOC) and families with children under 18 are being held in so-called family units.</p> <p>Only in 3 specific cases a (few) nights can be spent in the closed detention facility called "Caricole":</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- In the case of a late arrival at the border: the families with children under 18 will go to the Caricole to spent the night because transfer in the night to a family unit is not feasible.</li> <li>- In the case of an early departure from the family unit: it is considered best for the family to spent the night prior to a departure in Caricole than to have to leave the family unit in the middle of the night to go to the airport.</li> <li>- In case of the UAM at the border where there are doubts the UAM will await the results in the Caricole.</li> </ul>
